12. History attachment: Susie was born full term with complications resulting in a delivery via cesarean. After birth, she required supplemental oxygen and was in the NICU for 48 hours. She began to lose weight at four weeks of age due to low muscle tone and a high vaulted hard palate. Feeding struggles have continued and remain delayed for her age. She rolled over at 12 months, sat up at 15 months, and is not yet walking fully independently at 18 months. At 18 months, she is not forming recognizable words. She is delayed in all areas, including speech, large muscle skills, small muscle skills, and cognitive processing, resulting in a global developmental delay. Genetic testing was completed based on these symptoms as well as macrocephaly, and Susie was found to have Poppins syndrome, which causes intellectual disability and hypotonia. Additional symptoms may include seizures, heart complications, and eye complications.

Rehabilitative Services required include therapies at the following frequencies: Physical therapy three times per week at 60 minutes per session, including aquatherapy; Occupational therapy two times per week at 60 minutes per session; Speech therapy three times per week at 30 minutes per session; Music therapy twice per week at 30 minutes per session.
